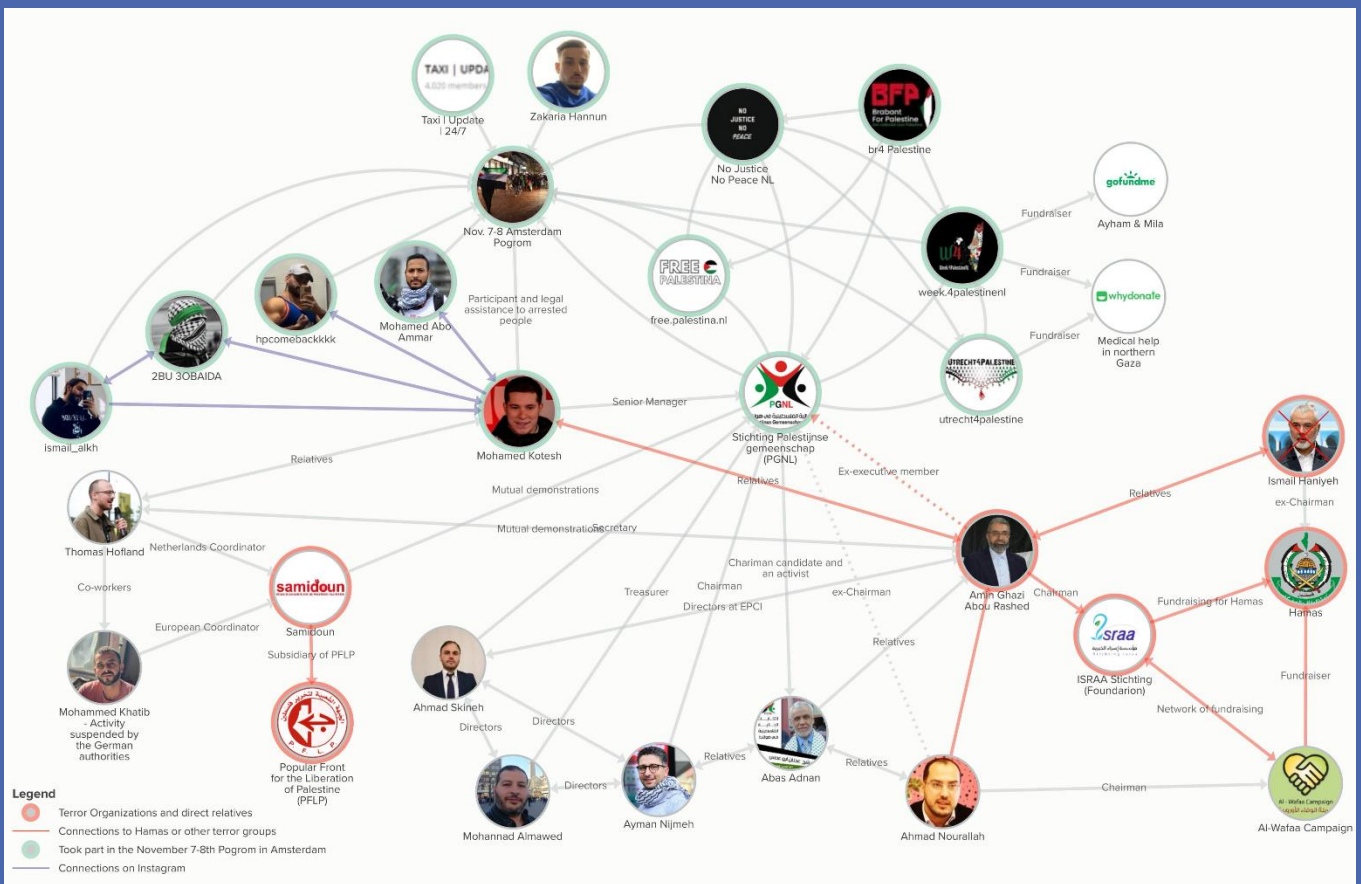

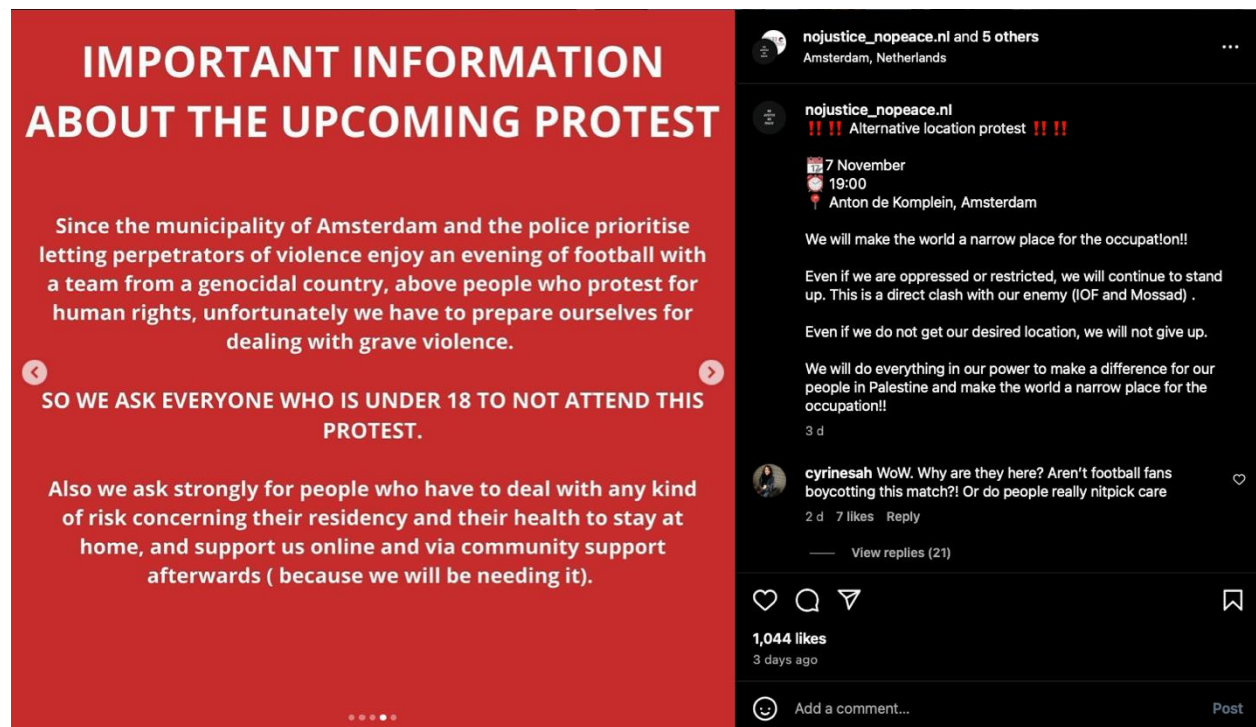

Executive Summary

On November 7-8, 2024, pro-Palestinian groups with ties to terror organizations Hamas and PFLP were involved in the pogrom of pro-Palestinian activists against Israeli tourists and Jewish people in Amsterdam.

One of the leading organizations was Stichting Palestijnse Gemeenschap (PGNL). PGNL has a network of connections with the local Muslim community and occasionally arranges pro-Palestinian protests and rallies in various cities in the Netherlands, including Amsterdam.

On November 7th, PGNL, alongside utrecht4palestine, br4palestine, week.4palestinenl, free.palestina.nl, and nojustice_nopeace.nl Instagram accounts organized a protest against the Maccabi Tel Aviv fans in Amsterdam. The organizations declared that they are prepared for “grave violence”¹ (See screenshot from Instagram below). Later that night, these organizations shared evidence live from the pogrom.



Therefore, we have a reason to believe that these organizations, led by PGNL, had a significant role in offsetting the 7 pm demonstration toward the Israeli fans and Jewish people after the soccer match.

The leaders of PGNL have strong connections to the Hamas terror organization through several touchpoints:

1. The previous executive member of the PGNL was **Amin Ghazi Abou Rashed**, who was arrested on suspicion of terrorism financing. He was suspected of raising around **EUR 11.9m on behalf of the militant organization Hamas**. Investigators reportedly seized a significant amount in cash and EUR

750,000 in bank accounts in related house searches. There are also pieces of evidence showing personal connections between Abou Rashed and Ismail Haniyeh.



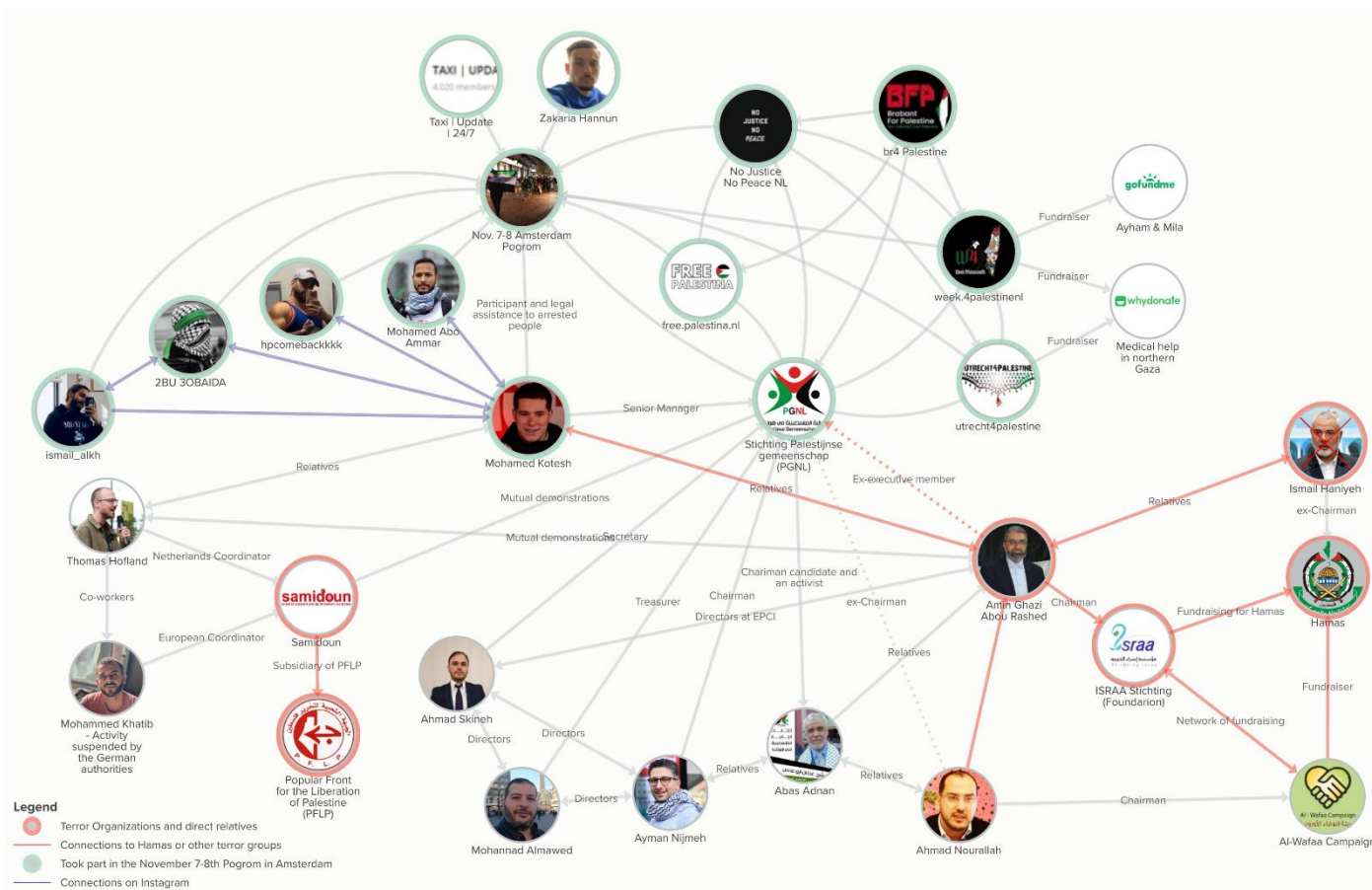
2. Ahmad Nourallah, the previous chairman of PGNL, was the head of the Al-Wafaa Foundation, a part of Union of Good, a network of fundraising charities for Hamas.
3. Mohamed Kotesch, a senior PGNL employee and a prominent figure in arranging pro-Palestinian protests in the Netherlands, has close ties to Abou Rashed. It's important to note that Kotesch and Abou Rashed are immigrants from the Palestinian refugee camp Yarmouk in Syria.

In addition to the relations between PGNL and Hamas, there are pieces of evidence showing the mutual activities of PGNL and the terror organization Samidoun, a subsidiary of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP).

We understand that PGNL played a significant role in driving people to action and organizing them to conduct the pogrom. The organization provided exact instructions on how to prepare and to expect “grave violence.” During the event, the Instagram profiles of these organizations published videos and photos from the pogrom—directly from their profiles or sharing relatives they have connections with from the events.

There is hard evidence showing many connections between PGNL officers and senior employees to Hamas and PFLP-related organizations and personnel.

We believe that this pogrom was driven by pro-Hamas propaganda and incitement against Israelis and Jewish people. Hamas propaganda was present in almost every post, reel, or photo shared.

Stichting Palestijnse Gemeenschap PGNL is a Palestinian organization based in the Netherlands. The organization organizes the activities of Dutch-based Palestinian organizations. It focuses on activities for the rights of the Palestinian people and supports promoting the interests of the Palestinian community in the Netherlands. In July 2017, a Jewish organization filed a complaint over group members shouting in Arabic about killing Jews at a rally in Rotterdam.²

The former executive management at PGNL was Amin Ghazi Abou Rashed. He is associated with fund-raising activities for the terrorist organization Hamas⁶. According to the last available copy of PGNL's website (currently not active), Abou Rashed was on the board of directors⁷ (translated from Arabic):

In recent years, the organization has undergone many internal changes when the elections for the leadership of the organization caused many disputes.

One of the leading candidates was Mohamed Kotes, a Syrian refugee from the Palestinian camp in Yarmouk, Syria. In the last year, Kotes led many demonstrations at PGNL, seen alongside Ayman Nijmeh, the current chairman.

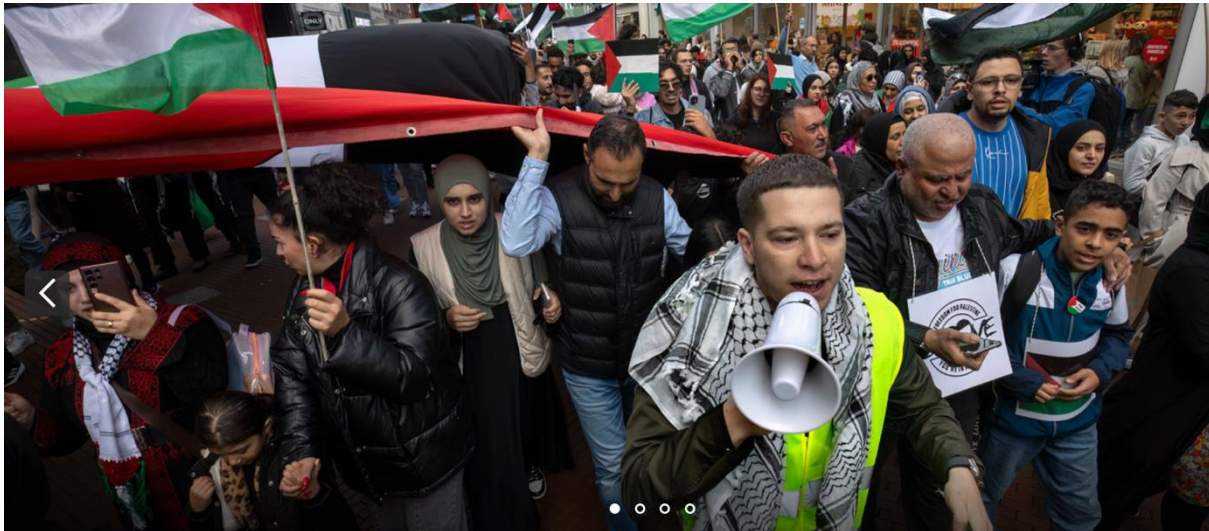
In addition, Kotes has strong connections to Amin Ghazi Abou Rashed. Both grew up in the Yarmouk refugee camp. Kotes was seen in different hearings Abou Rashed had as part of his trial.⁸

Connections to terror organizations

The leaders of PGNL have strong connections to the Hamas terror organization through several touchpoints:

Amin Ghazi Abou Rashed

The previous executive member of the PGNL was **Amin Ghazi Abou Rashed**, who was arrested on suspicion of terrorism financing. He was suspected of raising around EUR 11.9m on behalf of the militant organization Hamas¹². There are also pieces of evidence showing personal connections between Abou Rashed and Ismail Haniyeh¹³.



Ahmad Nourallah – Al-Wafaa Campaign, the Israa Foundation, and endorsement of Hamas

Ahmad Nourallah, the previous chairman of PGNL, was the head of the Al-Wafaa Foundation, a part of Union of Good, a network of fundraising charities for Hamas.




He is also originally from the Yarmouk refugee camp. He is considered a senior leader in the Muslim and Hamas activity in the Netherlands.¹⁴

Al-Waffa Campaign

Al-Wafaa Campaign defines itself as a fund created in coordination between a group of Palestinian aid institutions in Europe whose common purpose is to contribute to the relief of suffering and fulfill the obligation towards Palestine and its children.¹⁵

The Israa Foundation and the Al-Wafaa Campaign are directly connected, as both are responsible for fundraising in the Netherlands (See the screenshot from Wafaa's website below, translated from Arabic).

Amin Abu Rashed and his daughter Israa were the heads of the Israa Foundation until they were arrested in June 2023. They were suspected of transferring 6 million euros to Hamas in Gaza through the foundation¹⁶.

Although the Al-Wafaa Campaign was not classified as a terrorist organization or investigated, its relationship with the Israa Foundation, known for fundraising, may indicate connections to Hamas.

Endorsing Hamas terror activity

On October 8th, the day after Hamas's murderous terrorist attack, Nourallah uploaded the image of Amin Abu Rashed and stated:

"Nothing does not express our joy in these blessed days and this victory of Gaza, its people and resistance, besides your absence from us and your presence, when you It is so much to Palestine, Gaza, to her people, her widows and the cries of her wrongs".¹⁷



On an additional Facebook post on October 8th, Nourallah shared the fighting between Hamas terrorists and the Israeli security forces fighting over Sderot's police station. In his post, he stated from the Quran, Surah Al-Hashr¹⁸:

"In the name of Allah, the Most Gracious, the Most Merciful. They thought their fortresses would protect them from Allah, but Allah came upon them from where they did not expect, and He cast terror into their hearts. They destroyed their houses by their own hands and the hands of the believers. So take a lesson, O people of insight."

This verse recounts the events related to the expulsion of the **Jewish tribe of Banu Nadir** from their fortresses in Medina. Banu Nadir had agreed with the Prophet Muhammad but later violated it. They believed their strong fortresses would protect them from any consequence, underestimating the power of Allah.

1. **False Security:** The verse illustrates how Banu Nadir relied on the physical security of their fortresses to shield them, failing to recognize that ultimate security is only in Allah's hands. Despite their confidence, Allah's plan reached them in a direction they hadn't anticipated.
2. **Fear and Consequence:** Allah instilled fear in their hearts, which weakened their resolve. This led them to the point where, in a desperate attempt, they even began destroying their own homes, either to prevent them from falling into the hands of Muslims or to salvage whatever they could.

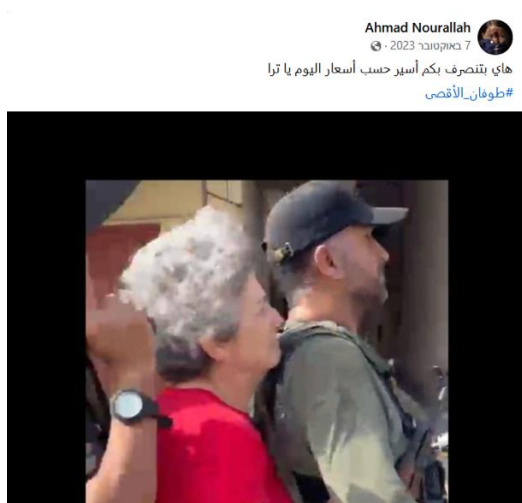
3. **Lesson for the Observant:** The verse ends with a message for those with insight. It calls people to reflect on this event as a reminder that reliance on material defenses is futile if it defies divine will.

This verse teaches lessons about misplaced confidence in worldly means and highlights the importance of understanding where proper protection and strength lie. It also warns us to be mindful of our actions and their consequences.



Nourallah supported Hamas and the murderous terrorist attack on social networks and even mocked a picture of an old lady who was kidnapped from an Israeli Kibbutz with the Hashtag "Flood Al-Aqsa":

"Some prisoners (intentionally to security prisoners and terrorists who stay in Israeli prisons) can be released for this kidnapper today?".¹⁹



Mohamed Kotesch – a pro-Palestinian senior leader and connections to terror organizations

Mohamed Kotesch, a senior PGNL employee and a prominent figure in arranging pro-Palestinian protests in the Netherlands, has close ties to **Abou Rashed**. It's important to note that Kotesch and Abou Rashed are immigrants from the Palestinian refugee camp Yarmouk in Syria²⁰.

Israa, the daughter, shared a picture of Kotesch welcoming Abou Rashed right after Abou Rashed was temporarily released from an arrest.

On his profile, Kotesch tags himself as part of PGNL. He also writes in Arabic the phrase "On your command," which is recognized as a sentence related to Hamas terrorists waiting for Mohammed Deif's command to act, who was the head of the Hamas military wing. The sentence was removed after the Pogrom.

In the picture on the right, Kotesch and Thomas Hofland, the Samidoun coordinator in the Netherlands, are demonstrating together.

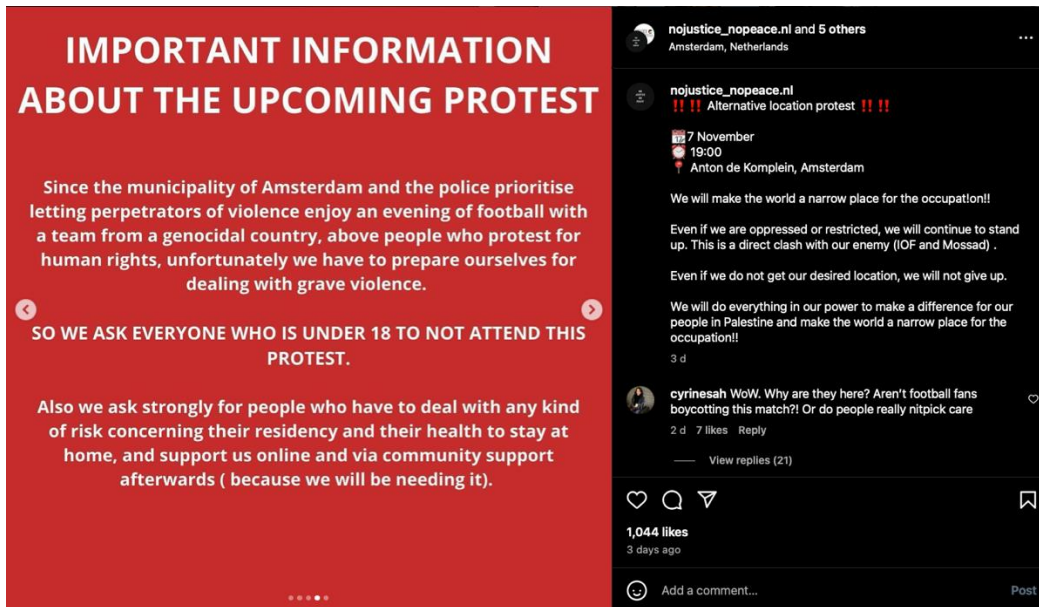


Hofland has ties to the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP). Samidoun was designated as a terror organization by the Israeli Ministry of Defense due to its activity as a subsidiary of PFLP in the world.

Involvement in the Amsterdam Pogrom

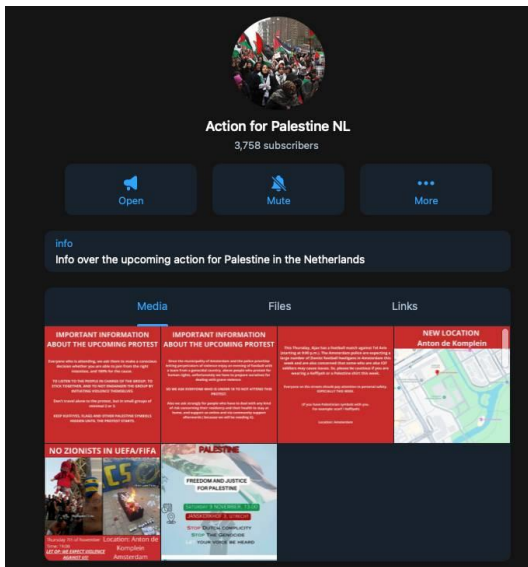
The PGNL has a network of connections with the local Muslim community. PGNL occasionally arranges pro-Palestinian protests and rallies in various cities in the Netherlands, including Amsterdam.

On November 7th, PGNL, alongside utrecht4palestine, br4palestine, week.4palestinenl, free.palestina.nl, and nojustice_nopeace.nl invited activists to a protest against Maccabi Tel Aviv fans in Amsterdam on their Instagram accounts. The organizations declared that they are prepared for “grave violence”²¹ (See screenshot from IG below). Later that night, these organizations shared evidence live from the pogrom.

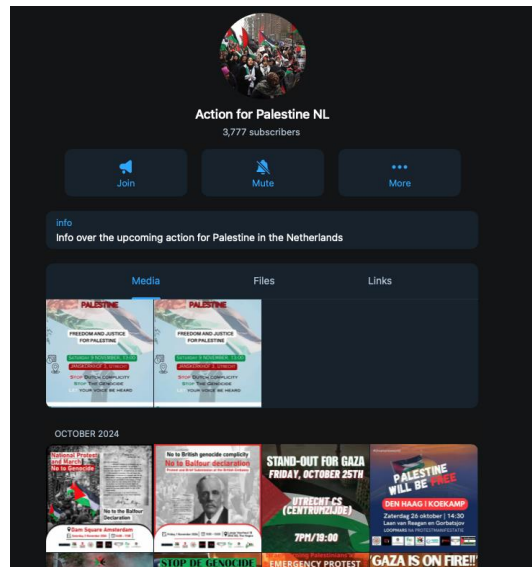

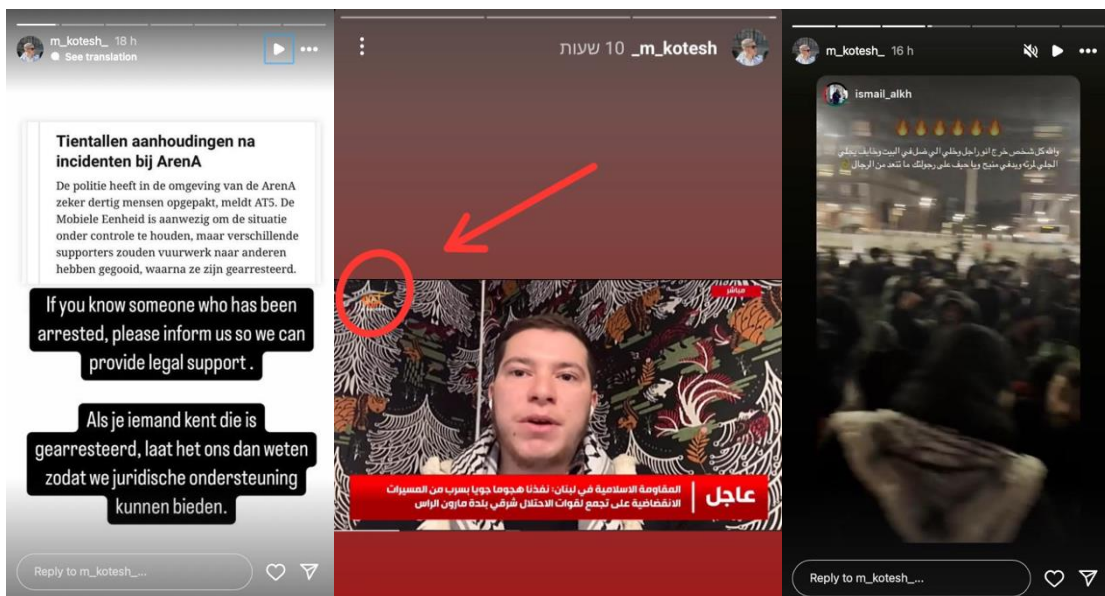

Therefore, we have a reason to believe that these organizations, led by PGNL, had a significant role in offsetting the 7 pm demonstration toward the Israeli and Jewish fans after the soccer match as they were preparing for a “grave violence”.

PGNL and other organizations posted many pieces of evidence from the pogrom, but most were deleted.

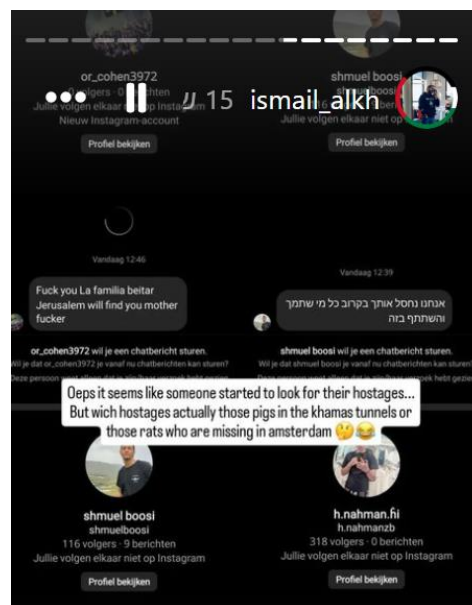

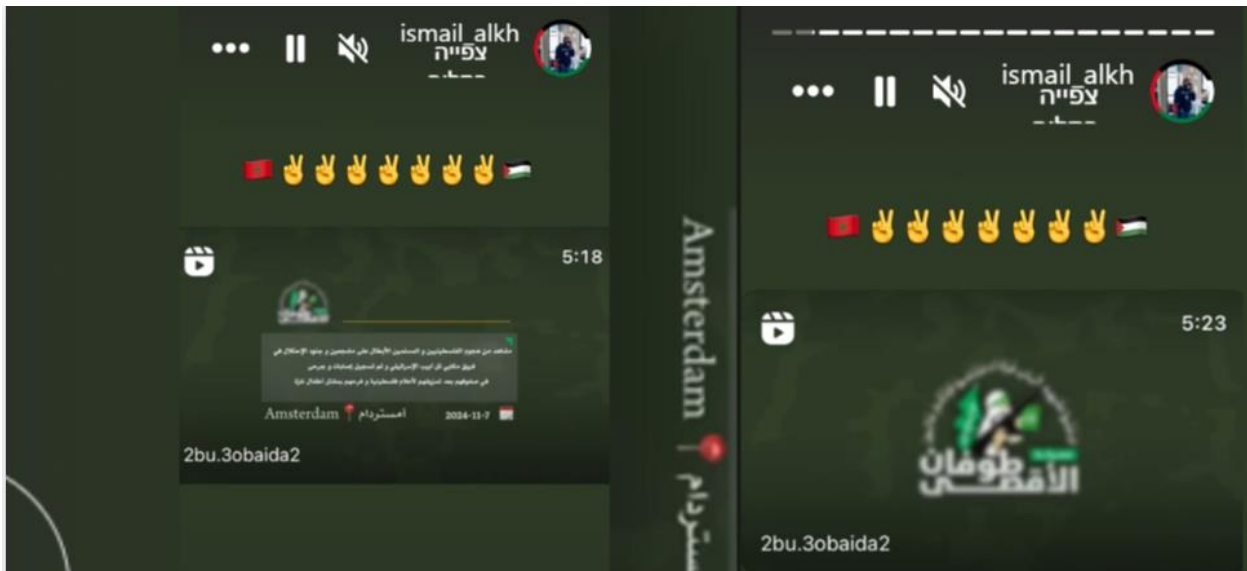
"Anyone who came out (that is, anyone who went to the streets and participated in the comment pogrom) is a real man, who is afraid to stay home and wash the dishes to his wife, what a breeze to your ladies, doesn't count you from men."

In a story that ismail_alkh posted during the pogrom, he wrote:

"Oeps it seems like someone started looking for their hostages... But wich hostages actually those pigs in the khamas tunnels or those rats who are missing in amsterdam?"



Another Instagram story ismail_alkh shared contained video taken from the Amsterdam Pogrom incidents, with an opening from Hamas military wing's videos from the war in Gaza:



After the Amsterdam Pogrom incidents, Kotesch explained the events in the Netherlands in an interview on various media channels. He claims that Maccabi Tel Aviv fans initiated the violence, which followed an attack on a Palestinian demonstration and buildings displaying Palestinian flags.

Kotesch was attempting to justify the violent incidents while demonstrating a clear understanding of what happened on the ground.²²

Therefore, we believe Kotesch participated in the event on the field or by communicating with local activists involved in the pogrom.

Another prominent Hamas supporter who was involved directly in the pogrom was an Instagram profile named "2BU 3OBAIDA", similar to Abu Obaida, the Hamas spokesperson. This profile has a mutual Instagram connection with Mohamad Kotesch and ismail_alkh.

2BU 3OBAIDA is deeply influenced by Hamas propaganda. He shares content with graphics from the Hamas official videos and uses graphics related to the terror activity of the Hamas military wing.

On November 9th, he published an edited 5-minute video of the pogrom of different videos he took during the incidents. The explanation of the video he called for violence (translated from Arabic):

"Kill them [can also be translated as "fight them"], Allah will **punish them with your hands**, and He will disgrace them, and He will help you over them, and heal the hearts of a believing people.

God is great 🙌❤️"



The video features distressing footage of violence against Israelis on the streets of Amsterdam.

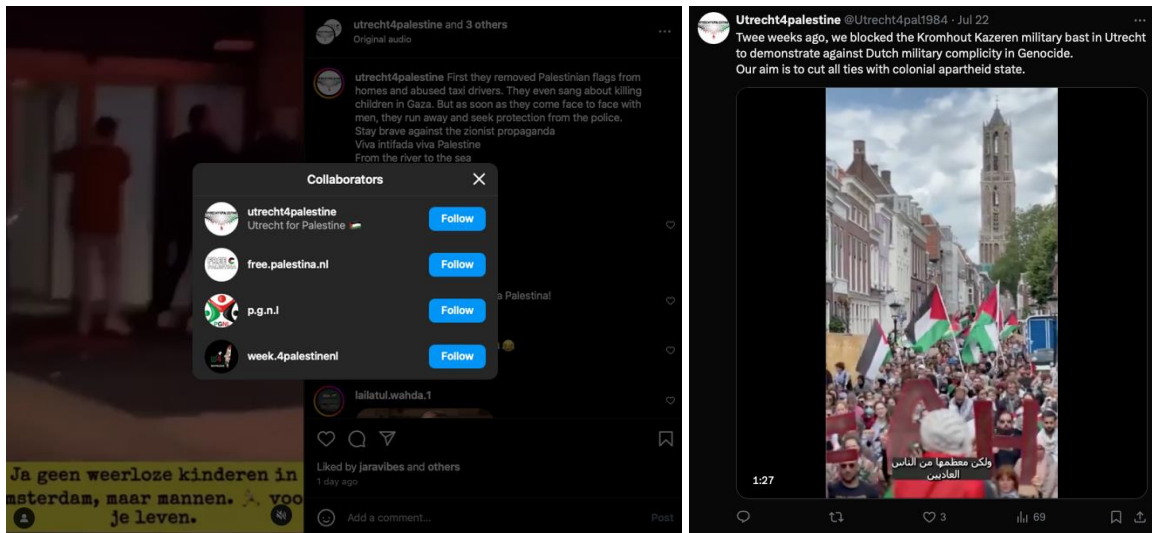

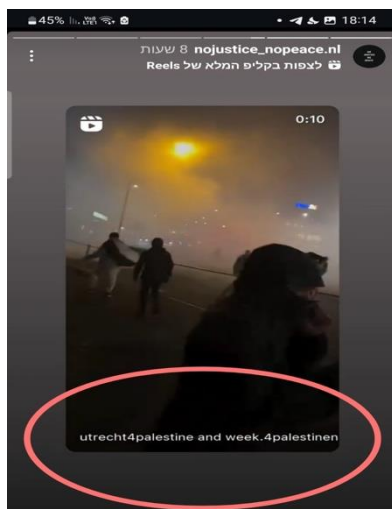

Utrecht 4 Palestine is a community-based group based in Utrecht that advocates for Palestinian rights. They are focused on local grassroots activities in Utrecht.

The group organizes protests, educational events, and campaigns at Utrecht University and within the broader community. Their activities often align with broader movements like BDS and aim to pressure institutions to divest from companies complicit in the "Israeli occupation".

The No Justice No Peace NL is a pro-Palestinian Instagram page. It uses the phrase of the National Action Network^a, a leading civil rights organization in the USA. According to our research, there is no evidence of connections between the American organization and the organization that identifies itself as “No Justice No Peace NL” in the Netherlands.

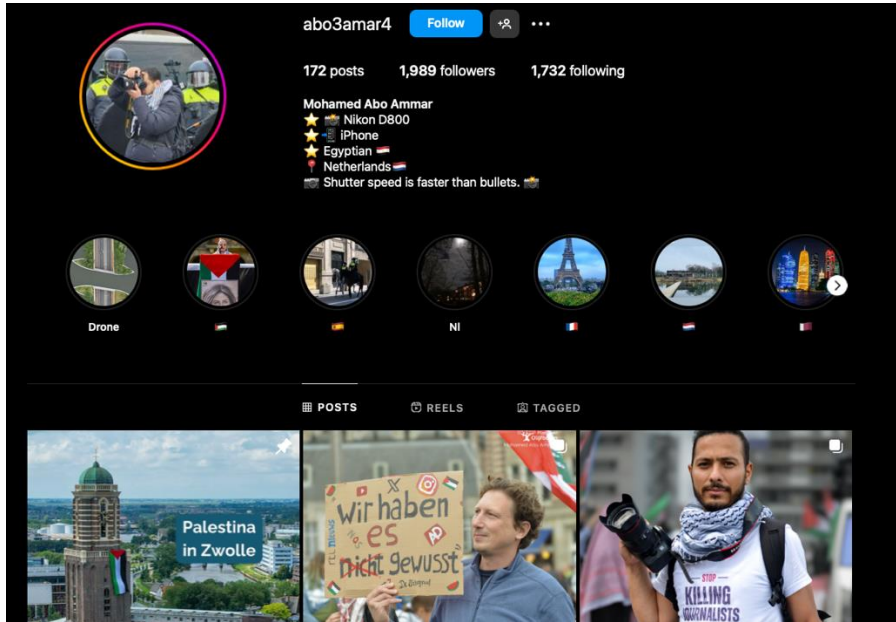
This organization is only active on social media, mainly Instagram. Its Instagram page has only 19 posts and 276 followers, and it follows 38 other profiles. Most content is about grassroots activities in the Netherlands, including demonstrations with violence against law enforcement and vandalism.

^a Founded in 1991 by Reverend Al Sharpton, NAN works within the spirit and tradition of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. to promote a modern civil rights agenda that includes the fight for one standard of justice, decency, and equal opportunities for all people regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, citizenship, criminal record, economic status, gender, gender expression, or sexuality.

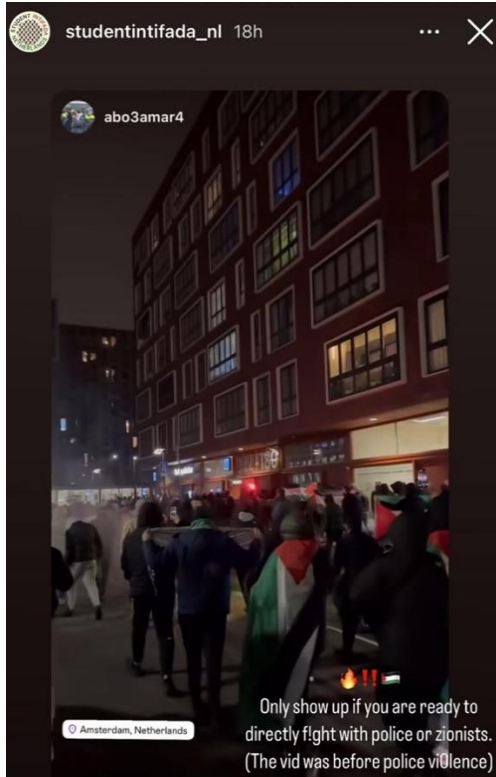


Left picture – involvement in the Amsterdam Pogrom; Right picture – invitation for a protest in the Netherlands

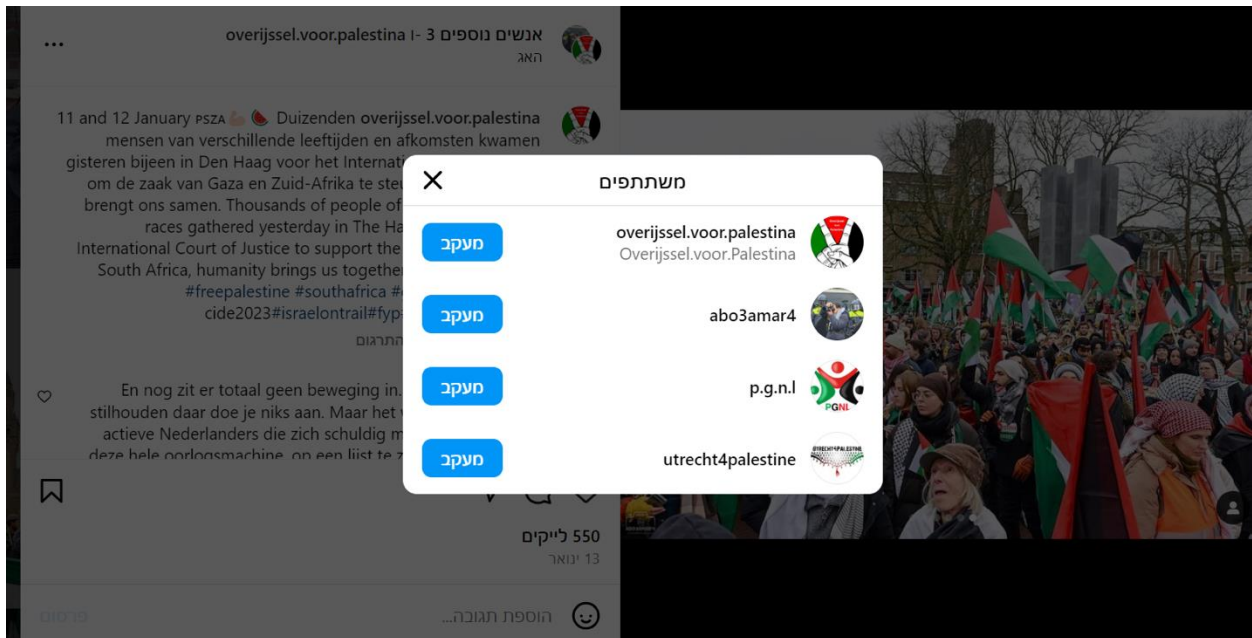
The organization follows one IG account called "Abo3amar4"²³, belonging to an Egyptian immigrant called Mohamed Abo Ammar. Abo Ammar is a photographer who participates in many demonstrations that take place in the Netherlands.

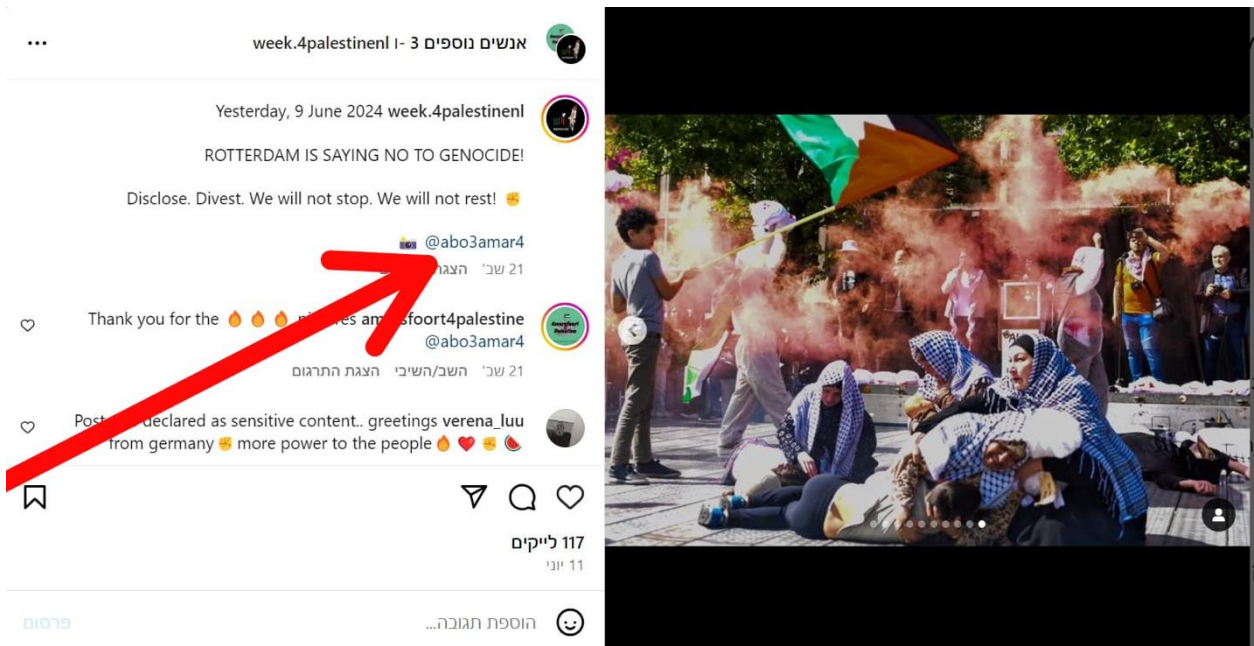
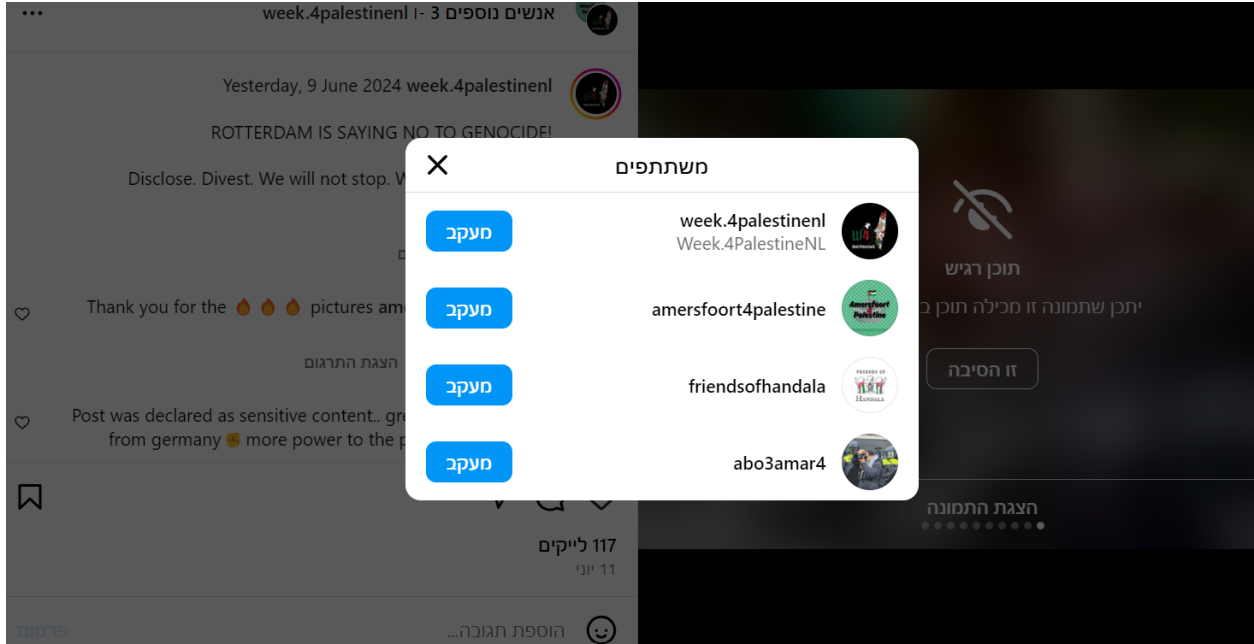

Week 4 Palestine NL is a solidarity initiative, started on March 2024, that raises awareness about the Palestinian struggle through weekly or periodic activities.

The group organizes events such as demonstrations, educational workshops, and cultural activities to keep the issue of Palestine in the public discourse. It aims to engage with the topic and continuously support Palestinian rights. The initiative took part in organizing the protests against Maccabi Tel Aviv fans in Amsterdam as part of the pro-Palestinian activity in the city²⁵.



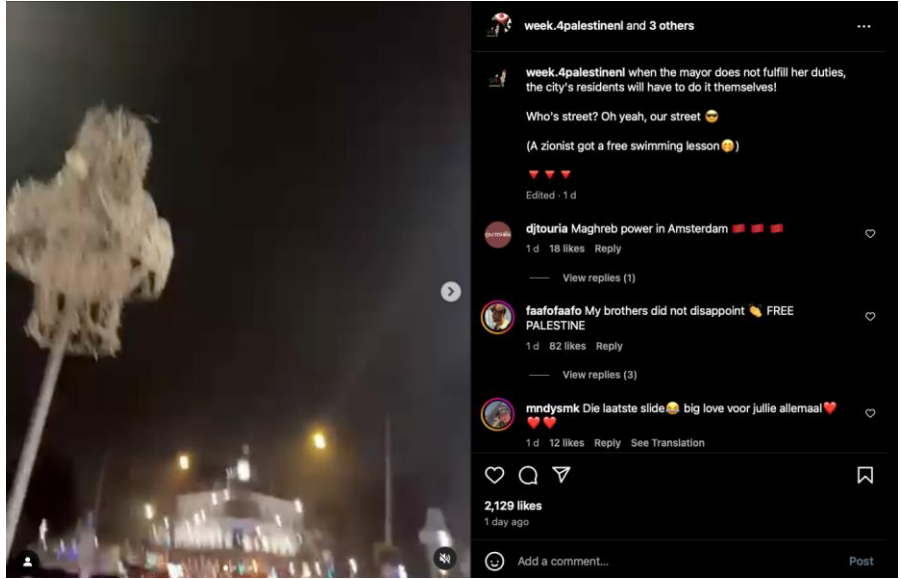
Calling for violence

During the Amsterdam Pogrom, the Instagram page of Week4Palestine NL endorsed the violence of the pro-Palestinian activists on the streets, stating²⁶:

"when the mayor does not fulfill her duties, the city's residents will have to do it themselves!

Who's street? Oh yeah, our street 😏

(A Zionist got a free swimming lesson 😏)



Fundraising activities

The initiative posts on its Instagram page two fundraising campaigns:

1. Support medical emergency efforts in besieged northern Gaza – Fundraising created in October 2024.
2. Save the child Ayham and Mila to escape the war on Gaza – Fundraising created in October 2024.

The group organizes protests, educational events, and campaigns to raise awareness about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. They often collaborate with international movements like Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions (BDS) to push for economic and political pressure on Israel.
